

25 Year Progression of the Development of Bible College Curriculum

1994: Utilization of teaching materials during mission outreaches. These ‘**International Leadership Training Courses**’ provided the ‘**core**’ of the Bible College curriculum throughout the countries we were traveling to.

1995: The early mission’s efforts into Vietnam found a complete lack of Christian Bible College opportunities.

1996: We visited India and Pakistan for evangelistic healing/miracle events and teaching leadership seminars.

1997: HOJGI answered a ‘Macedonia call’ from an isolated people group in the northeast region of India where there were no opportunities for Christian ministry training, Manipur state. We began at that time to partner with Triune Biblical University of Kelso, Washington USA, to develop a correspondence course for an Associate Degree in Ministry & Missions.

1998: HOJGI staff traveled to Imphal, Manipur State, India to provide a Christian Leadership training seminar. The initial **HOJSPM Correspondence College for Associate Degree in Ministry and Missions** was presented at that time to local leaders and the first HOJSPM Bible College was inaugurated.

2000: The first 10 graduates of the **Associate Degree** program in Imphal included both men and women.

2003: HOJ-India began the transition from a correspondence school to an on-site Bible College taught by indigenous Christian leaders. Mature leaders and Bible College graduates began to teach the same courses that were offered earlier by correspondence with the HOJSPM headquarters in Tacoma, Washington.

2006: Began the transition to a “**Copyright Free**” **Bible College Curriculum**. The original textbooks used in the correspondence model had been primarily purchased in Christian bookstores in America and mailed to India for use in the school. A more cost-effective method would be to provide a copyright-free ‘Master-set’ of documents for each course that could be owned by the **Target Bible College** (indigenous Bible College in a foreign country) and copied as needed by the administrators of that Bible College to meet the needs of the students currently enrolled in the program.

This “one-time” investment by **Harvest of Jubilee School of Prayer and Missions** could be used for many future classes of Bible students in the indigenous areas and updated or expanded as needed to fit the needs of each school. The new the curriculum was piloted at the Bible College already in place in Imphal, Manipur State, India.

2012: Digitally scanning all the documents began and provided the opportunity to provide the entire curriculum and additional materials on a USB thumb drive, memory stick. The digital curriculum was quickly circulated to other locations via hand-carried by missionaries or postal courier.

The 1-year Diploma course was added to the curriculum package.

2013: With the acquisition of a second Master's Degree and a Doctorate's Degree, Janice Woodrum proceeded with the development of the **Bachelor of Divinity Curriculum**. This was launched in Imphal, Manipur State, India, in 2015 and has now become a general offering of the curriculum package. The Bachelor of Divinity is not 'copyright free' in the same manner as the other portions of the HOJ-ICBS Curriculum Package.

2016: HOJ-ICBS inaugurated a 'collegium association for those locations utilizing the HOJ-ICBS Curriculum Package.' HOJ-ICBS began providing Franchise Agreements to the collegium members authorizing them to reproduce and multiply the curriculum under their own autonomy and to multiple additional training locations and Bible College facilities.

2017: Five 6-month '**Continuing Education Courses**' were added to the available curriculum package. A second 1-year Diploma Course was also added to the offering.

2018: The identity of **Harvest of Jubilee School of Prayer and Missions** was changed to **Harvest of Jubilee International Collegium of Biblical Studies**. 2018 concluded with more than 140 locations utilizing the **HOJ-ICBS Bible College Curriculum Package** in one manner or another in 32 countries.

2019: **HOJ-ICBS** began to design and develop a web site offering the curriculum via the internet. The website will also be made available at no expense to the members of the collegium.

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
